

LIMASSOL



At **Kourion** you can enjoy musical and theatrical performances. It is an amazing theater that was built in the 2nd century BC with its seating area accommodating around 3500 people.



Kolossi Medieval Castle is one of the most important **extant fortification** works of the Frankish period. It was built in 1210 by the Order of St. John of Jerusalem (Knights Hospitallers) as the seat of the Supreme military commandment, Grande Commanderie, from where Commandaria wine later took its name.



The Limassol winemaking villages are famous for their deep-rooted history of viticulture, as well as their excellent local wines and the stunning scenery of the area that produces them.

Located on the southern slopes of the Troodos mountain range the villages are known as 'Krasochoria', which is comprised of the two Greek words for 'wine' and 'villages.'

**Petra tou Romiou the place of
birth of the goddess Aphrodite**



Baths of Aphrodite is the place where the goddess of Love used to take her bath. According to mythology, this is where Aphrodite met Adonis, when he stopped off for a drink while hunting, to quench his thirst. The moment he drank the water Adonis fell in love with the goddess.



Lara Beach is the beach with the most beautiful sunset. You have to be careful as there are turtles -*Caretta-caretta*, creating their nests in the area and is very possible you see baby turtles are taking their first steps towards the sea. **The only habitants are wild goats, birds and turtles.**

AMMOCHOSTOS

Cavo Greco National Forest Park is very popular for divers and cyclists. **Special cycling paths also exist in the area.** You can also take a boat trip along the coast anchoring a cave.
